2: Eligibility Determination	7: 45-Day Timeline	Percentage of eligible infants and toddlers with an IFSP for whom an evaluation and assessment and an initial IFSP meeting were conducted within Part C's 45-day timeline
3: IFSPs	1: Timely Services	Percentage of infants and toddlers with an IFSP who receive the early intervention services on their IFSP in a timely manner
	3: Early Childhood Outcomes	Percentage of infants/toddlers with an IFSP who demonstrate improved (a) positive social-emotional skills, including social relationships, (b) acquisition and use of knowledge and skills, including early language/communication, and (c) use of appropriate behaviors to meet their needs
4: Services in Natural Environments	2: Natural Environments	Percentage of infants and toddlers with an IFSP who primarily receive early intervention services in the home or in programs for typically developing children

	10: Complaint Resolution	Percentage of signed written complaints with reports issued that were resolved within a 60-day timeline or a timeline extended for a particular complaint due to exceptional family circumstances

	9: Noncompliance Correction	General supervision system (including monitoring, complaints, hearings, etc.) identifies and corrects noncompliance as soon as possible but in no case later than one year from identification
